

Liturgy Leanings for October, 2020

October Sundays are the 27th through the 30th Sundays in Ordinary Time; there are 34 Sundays in the liturgical year. The current year uses the Cycle A readings of a three-year cycle. The liturgical color for the season of Ordinary Time is green. The color for the various saints' feast days/memorials that are observed during October is usually white or red, depending on whether or not the saint was a martyr.

October is "Respect Life Month," as well as the "Month of the Most Holy Rosary." Sunday, October 4, is "Respect for Life Sunday," and October 18 is "World Mission Sunday."

Saints whose memorials are observed during October:

- 10/1—Saint Therese Martin—"The Little Flower," or "Therese of Lisieux:" her "little way" of doing small things with great love has inspired millions; died of tuberculosis in 1897 at age 24; a Doctor of the Church
- 10/2—The Holy Guardian Angels: traditionally believed that each person has been assigned an angel guardian, because every soul is precious to God
- 10/7—Our Lady of the Rosary: Our Lady appeared to Saint Dominic and gave him the rosary as a way to convert those who were not Christians; Dominicans are credited with developing devotion to the rosary
- 10/11—Saint Pope John XXIII: Called Vatican Council II in 1959; visited the imprisoned in Rome, reached out to the sick, welcomed visitors of every faith and nation, modeled the Good Shepherd; Canonized July 5, 2013 by Pope Francis
- 10/15—Saint Teresa of Jesus, also known as Saint Teresa of Avila: a Carmelite known for her reforms of the Order, adopting a life of poverty and abstinence; her writings offer spiritual wisdom for a deeper union with God and neighbor; a Doctor of the Church
- 11/16—Saint Margaret Mary Alacogue: experienced visions of Christ and called attention to devotion of the Sacred Heart of Jesus
- 11/18—Saint Luke, the Evangelist: a Gentile, author of a gospel and the Acts of the Apostles; patron saint of physicians and artists
- 11/19—The North American Martyrs: Saint John de Brebeuf and Isaac Jogues, Jesuits priests, who worked among the Huron nation in North America, where they were martyred
- 10/20—Saint Paul of the Cross (1694-1775): founded the Passionist Order, who live strict monastic life and foster devotion to the Passion of Christ through preaching and missions
- 10/22—Saint Pope John Paul II: His holiness was reflected through his humanity and as a tireless, charismatic leader of the Church; started World Youth Day; visited the United States three times; canonized April 27, 2014 by Pope Francis
- 10/28—Saints Simon and Jude Thaddeus: apostles mentioned in the New Testament, martyred in Persia

Is there a minimum I need to donate?
