Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him... (Matthew 1:24). St. Joseph, most obedient and most prudent, pray for us!

As we close the month of January, my heart compels me to offer one final thought about the controversy concerning the vaccines and other recent challenges. I know I have already said quite a bit, but it is simply my desire today to make a clarification and one final statement, both because I know I may not have communicated perfectly and because there is still a lingering unease among the people of God. As for the clarification, I simply want to say that it was always my hope and intention simply to give guidance and not to criticize anyone's personal decision on the matter. To those choosing to take one of the vaccines already discussed, I do believe that there is good, reasonable grounds for that decision, and to those who choose not to (which is also an acceptable option), please be gracious and understanding toward your brothers and sisters who choose otherwise and try not to be quick to judge or make assumptions. As for a final statement, the reason it still pains my heart to think of this matter is precisely because I see the Enemy at work, trying to use this situation to divide God's people and to divide the pro-life movement. When I see him at work, I feel that it is my duty to call him out for the snake that he is and cast light on his efforts, so that we can become wise to them. This is what I call crushing his head, as it is part of how we participate in Christ's victory and freedom. We must resist his efforts and the only way to do that is through compassion, understanding and merciful love. These simple, but powerful weapons against division call us to respect one another, as we all strive to do the best we can with the very challenging circumstances life has dealt us. Let us not allow this to be another way of dividing against one another. There has been much opportunity for this type of division being introduced into the pro-life movement the past few years, as we had a president supporting pro-life efforts who was a man that many good people - for a wide variety of other reasons - simply could not support, even if many of them voted for him, simply because they saw him as the most viable alternative to a candidate who promises to promote the killing of unborn children. If you did support him (and please notice that I did not say one way or another whether I did), I'm not criticizing you. I'm simply asking you to understand this, hoping that we all may have our eyes opened to how cleverly the Enemy uses these things to divide us and stop playing into his hands. And let's be clear about who the Enemy is.

Saint Paul said it best: "For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens" (Ephesians 6:12). I am not declaring any politician or voter my enemy. I won't. As for those politicians who threaten the dignity of life, by promoting the killing of innocent unborn children, such as our current president, I pray

for the conversion of their hearts and hope that they may one day be our ally. Those of us already striving to defend the dignity of life, let us remain united in truth and in love, praying to God with hope, as we humbly strive to be instruments in the hand of Jesus Christ, our Merciful King.

<u>Feb. 7th Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time</u> - In this weeks readings our Lord speaks his commands and illness is cured and unclean spirits are driven away. Jesus' command over nature and the supernatural clearly illustrates his identity.

<u>Feb. 8th St. Jerome Emilliani</u> - founded hospitals, orphanages, and hostels in Venice, Italy. St. Josephine Bakhtaran, Virgin - kidnapped from her childhood home in Darfur under a series of cruel owners. Eventually claimed her freedom as a Canossian sister in Italy. Her holiness and kindness as porter endeared her to the local

<u>Feb. 10th St. Scholastica</u>, Virgin - Knowing that she would die soon, she prayed up a literal storm to extend a visit with her brother, St. Benedict, by another night.

<u>Feb. 11th Our Lady of Lourdes</u> - On this day, the church recognizes the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin to St. Bernadette Soubirous, although not known for great intellect, was able to articulate the Virgin as "The Immaculate Conception."

<u>Feb. 14th Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time</u> - We are called to live in imitation of our Lord.

<u>Feb.17th Ash Wednesday</u> - As intensely personal as Lent is, with its core disciplines of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, it is a time of preparing a people worthy of the Lords special care. As much as we must work on our individual hearts, Lent is also a time when we must work on the heart of the community calling it to a change of life.

Feb. 18th Thursday After Ash Wednesday - Following God leads us to life. Without God, we perish.

<u>Feb. 19th Friday After Ash Wednesday</u> -Don't just avoid food and finer things—share them with those who really need them.

<u>Feb. 20th Saturday After Ash Wednesday</u> - The Lord, through Isaiah, is telling us to quit lying and spreading meanness. He is telling us to share our food, to help the afflicted, and to free all those who are in chains.

<u>Feb. 21st First Sunday in Lent</u> - As Lent begins, we are reminded these forty days are a time to repent of sin, return to the Gospel, and recommit ourselves to our baptismal promises.

<u>Feb. 22nd The Chair Of St. Peter The Apostle</u> - This feast celebrates Peters pastoral authority over the Church continued through the ministry of the bishop of Rome. The chair, symbolizes authority. Catholics celebrate the unity of faith that the pope both symbolizes and works to secure.

<u>Feb. 23rd St. Polycarp, Bishop and Martyr, c.69-c.155.</u> Martyred by beheading. He is one of the earliest Christians whose writings we still have.

<u>Feb. 28th Second Sunday in Lent</u> - In today's scripture insights we are called to a steadfast faith in God. Our Lord did not spare his only son from the suffering of his life and death. Like Abraham, we are called to faithfully trust in God. As Abraham was faithful to God, God is faithful to us.
