A Note From the Pastor

Dear St. Malachy Parishioners,

"Behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). These final words of Our Lord in Matthew's Gospel, before ascending to the Father, have echoed throughout this Year of Presence. A disciple lives in God's Presence, first of all, because of His promise to us that He would be with us always. This weekend, as we celebrate Pentecost, we begin to understand how He meant those words, despite that He was about to depart from them. Immediately after He ascended, the Gospel of Mark tells us that, "the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs" (Mark 16:20). Again, we have this puzzling assertion that the Lord remained with them, after departing from them. How? The beginning of Acts of the Apostles answers the question, as it gives us even more of His final words to His disciples: "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you" (Acts 1:8). When the Holy Spirit descends upon them at Pentecost, the Lord comes to dwell with them, among them and indeed within them.

This new life that He has given to the Church by His Spirit is later described: "*They* devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers" (Acts 2:42). Furthermore, Saint Paul later describes this breaking of the bread in his First Letter to the Corinthians: "The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? ... For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus, on the night he was handed over, took bread, and, after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me" (1 Corinthians 10:16, 11:23-25).

Therefore, as the early Christians understood, chief among the gifts given to us by

the Holy Spirit is the gift of the Eucharist. In two weeks, we will celebrate this gift in a profound manner in the **Solemn Feast of Corpus Christi** (**The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**). This year, we will be continuing the two ways we celebrated last year, in addition to adding an exciting new element:

- Saturday, 5 PM Explanatory Mass
- Sunday, 8:15 AM Mass will conclude with a Eucharistic Procession
- Sunday, 10:30 AM Mass will conclude with a short procession to the Mahoney Shelter, where outdoor adoration will continue all afternoon, closing with vespers and benediction at 4 PM.

<u>All are welcome, invited and encouraged</u> to stop in at any hour of the day for outdoor adoration. However, there are specific slots when specific groups are asked to help accompany Our Lord.
