# 2020 Summer Newsletter Loving People to LIFE for 18 Years!

I'm excited to announce that Women's Choice Center is celebrating 18 years of ministry and pro-life service in our Quad Cities Area Community. You may have been among the thousands speaking out since 1995 when Planned Parenthood first announced its intention to open a clinic here. Or you may have participated or prayed when "Life & Family" organized prayer vigils for many years to end abortion. Our original property on Happy Joe Drive was purchased in November 1999 followed by a \$1.1 million capital campaign with our permanent structure opening in July 2002 when our first abortion vulnerable woman came to us for assistance. Since then thousands have come through our doors and we've positively influenced 1,304 babies who were saved from abortion – and that number grows daily (88-92% average choose LIFE). Just think of the thousands more linked by relationships that have been blessed by these protected ones' lives.

Abortion solves <u>nothing</u>. Planned Parenthood still works to exploit women in their most vulnerable periods of life. Women deserve better. Children and their families deserve better, too. As we look at the current state of our nation and our world, we're inspired daily to continue our ministry in prayer and to provide free services while supporting families who choose LIFE. Because you are reading this newsletter, I can also say "thank you" for your commitment to support Women's Choice Center as we remain dedicated to educate every woman we meet daily – and every day to come.

A time of crisis is the most likely time when life-altering decisions for abortion can happen. 2020 is a crisis year none of us will ever forget! Our Women's Choice Center team has remained OPEN navigating through the recent COVID-19 pandemic without closing a single day since the outbreak. Praise God! We've safely provided our free, essential services while connecting with moms in this additional crisis period and following CDC Guidelines to maintain a safer, low-risk environment for everyone. While so much has changed during these past few months, our commitment to LIFE is stronger than ever. Our caring, compassionate approach to loving each person where she is at and providing life-affirming choices is our commitment, especially during times of uncertainty like these.

We're looking forward to welcoming Kirk Walden to our 2020 Fundraising Luncheon and Dinner on September 29<sup>th</sup> (see back page for details). As we organize for whatever meeting situation exists at that time, Waterfront Convention Center is prepared for social distancing for everyone's safety. I'm looking forward to introducing you to Kirk after meeting him last year at Heartbeat International Headquarters. I'm confident you'll be inspired by Kirk's tremendous hope and vision when our current social and political structure is aligned against protecting the most innocent.

I've never lived in a time where I felt using my voice and my gifts mattered as much as they do right now. I encourage all of us to use this election year to research and vote our faith and values. We need you now more than ever to stay connected with your time, talent and treasure in supporting and protecting LIFE at WCC. Planned Parenthood's local clinic may be closed, but the number of chemical abortions is rising dramatically. Think about this... one abortion happens every 96 seconds and there are over 98 abortions per hour. That number comes directly from the Guttmacher Institute who maintains data for PP. Be aware, the battle continues! Prayers and action for LIFE, for religious freedoms, and for our nation are critical at this time in history.


#### Diaper Giveaways Bless Our Community By Sarah Jansen, LCSW



Grace, our Mobile Medical Unit, has not been able to be on the road providing medical services due to COVID-19 restrictions. Women's Choice Center wanted to remind the community that we still love them and are here for them. During two weeks in June, we loaded the Mobile Medical Unit with diapers and held four drive-through Diaper Give-aways at our parking locations in Rock Island, Davenport, and Moline. At each site, a line of cars was already waiting for us when we arrived in the Mobile Medical Unit. We set things up and immediately started to serve these families. In four events and over a total of four short hours, we were able to bless almost 150 families through our Diaper Giveaways. Most of these families had never heard of Women's Choice Center. They were so thankful and excited to learn they could continue to get emergency diapers by calling us at our Center. (Since then, we've gained several new families now coming to WCC and picking up weekly.)

It was amazing to be out in our community, meeting people who need us but never knew we existed. We sweated under our face shields, but it was refreshing to give loving smiles to the families as we wished them blessings on their day. One particularly hot day, our hearts were encouraged when a family we had just given

diapers to came back to the Mobile Medical Unit carrying a large tray. On the tray was ice cold water and a large container of juice. The mother we had served was so grateful for our presence in her neighborhood and wanted to thank us, knowing how hot the work was that we were doing. While times during this pandemic are hard, God is always good. Anything can be used to demonstrate His glory, even the coronavirus. We were able to show God's love during the Diaper Giveaways and were more than happy to receive that love back through our grateful clients.





### **Maria's Story**

After driving by one of our heavily trafficked locations, "Maria" impulsively came to our Mobile Medical Unit for a pregnancy test. She and her husband had been unsuccessfully trying to have a baby for 10 years, and recently had agreed to stop fertility treatments due to the financial burden. Maria was apprehensive about taking a pregnancy test for fear of another negative result.

We provided the client with a pregnancy test that did, in fact, come back negative. We were then able to be a safe, open space for the client to grieve and share some of her pent up frustrations about her infertility journey.

As Maria was unfamiliar with the option of following up with a NaPro (Natural Procreative) doctor, we educated her on the NaPro perspective and provided her with referrals to a local NaPro-certified physician assistant. We also referred her to free counseling at our Center, when she shared that she had a lot of anxiety and depression from years of unsuccessful fertility treatments.

When we followed up with Maria, we learned that she had reached out to the NaPro doctor and felt encouraged by the possibility of learning more about why she was struggling to conceive. She also had seen our professional counselor and reported that it was a very supportive experience. Maria is a great reminder of the blessing of pregnancy and children. We are glad to have had the opportunity to provide support to her in her sorrow and to continue to pray for the future of her family!
